Saint Bernardine was born at Massa Marittima in Tuscany in 1380. He entered the Friars Minor and, after being ordained to the priesthood, traveled throughout Italy preaching with great success. He increased devotion to the holy name of Jesus and fostered learning and discipline in his Order. He also wrote theological treatises. Saint Bernardine died at Aquila in 1444.

READING 1 Peter 5:1-4







You yourself are the only visible possession of our holy pastors,—let none of them, won at the price of your blood, remain far from you.


